Dear Ms. Major:

We are in receipt of your request for information pursuant to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act, 5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.* (“**FOIA**”).

On April 15, 2016, we received your request for any reports or records of the Metra Police Department concerning an incident involving [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] that occurred on February 25, 2016, including any documents, photographs, audio or visual recordings, or other records attached to any such reports (“**Request**”).

Metra attorney Thomas Stuebner spoke to you by phone concerning your Request on April 20, and you agreed to narrow down the scope of your Request to only police reports, with the understanding that you may submit future requests for additional information.

While FOIA allows a public body to deny duplicative requests from the same requestor as being unduly burdensome, (5 ILCS 140/3(g)), we are again providing you with a copy of police report #MP-16-00006521 concerning the incident between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on February 25, 2016, which was previously provided to you in response to your FOIA request 16-FOIA-100. We understand that this copy of the report is lacking and we are searching for a clearer version. Once we are able to obtain the clearer version, we will supplement this request.
